

Recently introduced to the US from Asia, the brown marmorated stink bug (*Halyomorpha halys*) is becoming a serious nuisance for agriculturists and home owners alike. This bug will feed on numerous agricultural crops (beans, peppers and apple) and seeks out *homes as an overwintering site in the fall*. It was found in New York in 2009 and is <u>expected to arrive</u> in Nova Scotia within a year or two.


How to Identify...



This bug WILL NOT harm people or animals, but will emit a foul odour when disturbed. It is a nuisance pest in the home and garden and potentially serious to growers.
